Citywide Parking Ban Declared Sunday, January 20 at 10:00 PM through 6:00 AM Monday, January 21

A Citywide Parking Ban has been declared beginning Sunday, January 20, 2019 at 10:00 PM through 6:00 AM Monday, January 21, according to the information posted below and issued by the City of Portland late this afternoon. Vehicles left on City streets after 10:00 PM tomorrow evening, (Sunday, January 20), can be towed at the owner's expense.

Due to the expected severity of the storm, and the fact that it is falling on a Sunday, the City would like to encourage residents to access snow ban lots tonight (Saturday, January 19). This will allow plow crews to have full access of city streets during the storm on Sunday. Residents may keep their cars in these lots from Saturday night through 8:00 AM on Monday, January 21. (Please keep in mind that typically cars must be out of snow ban lots by 7:00 AM, but an exception is being made given it is a holiday and schools are not in session.)

The City is also offering a special snow ban rate at both Elm & Spring St garages tonight and tomorrow night. In after 5 PM tonight, out by Monday at 8 AM, for \$6! Anything outside of those hours will be charged at the hourly rate.

PARKING BAN INFORMATION

The City offers numerous free options for parking on the peninsula during a snow ban. These lots are available after 5:00 PM on weekdays on the day a ban is called unless otherwise posted. School lots and unrestricted parking areas can be accessed earlier on weekends. All vehicle owners must remove their vehicles from these designated areas listed below by 7:00 AM (except for school lots, which are 6:30 AM) the morning the ban is removed. The City may tow, at the owner's expense, any vehicle which has not been removed by the 7:00 AM deadline:

- **Deering Oaks** - on the Tennis Court Road only - only on the left side of the road. No parking on the right side.
- **Deering Oaks** - State Street Ext. Parking Lot
- **Fitzpatrick Stadium** parking lot - this is the lot behind the Ice Arena. Do not park adjacent to the Ice Arena
- **Hadlock Field** parking lot
- **All Portland Public School parking lots** except the Reiche School lot which abuts the school and basketball court *Must be out by 6:30 AM.
- **Cutter Street lots (off the Eastern Prom) and, Eastern Prom - Turner to East End School property light pole 33 (waterside)**
- **Beach St.** lot accessible from Commercial St. after 8 p.m.
- **City lot at the corner of Park and Commercial streets** across the street from the
- **IMT (International Marine Terminal)** AKA Angelo's Acre 441 Commercial St.
- **On Peaks Island, snow ban parking is available at the Welch St. parking lot**
- **Western Prom** - Bowdoin to West Street (waterside)
- **Marginal Way** - Plowman to just before the entrance area to the east End Wastewater treatment Plant (waterside) ** Please do not park on Marginal Way if there is flooding or standing water. **Parking is not allowed in the Maine DOT park and ride lot.
- **Preble Street Extension Parking Lot** (Across from Hannaford) - adhere to the spaces that are designated for snow ban parking.
- **State Street Extension** - Parking is available on State St Ext between Forest Ave & Park Ave across from the entrance to Deering Oaks Park. Left side of the road only where parking is


typically available. Adhere to any no parking signs closest to Forest Ave.

Most parking garages will be available during snow bans at reduced rates. Elm Street Parking Garage will be open (it is typically closed on a Sunday.)

Vehicles must be out of these alternate parking lots by 7:00 AM (unless otherwise noted) the morning the ban is lifted.

**COASTAL FLOOD WARNING IN EFFECT
FROM 8 AM TO 1 PM EST SUNDAY**

The National Weather Service has issued a Coastal Flood Warning, which is in effect from 8 AM to 1 PM EST Sunday. The Coastal Flood Watch is no longer in effect.

- * TIMING...From 8 AM to 1 PM EST Sunday.
- * Impacts...Minor to moderate coastal flooding, along with splash over and beach erosion.
- * Location...Seacoast New Hampshire and southwest Maine coast.
- * Coastal Flooding...Some inundation of low lying areas near the shoreline is possible, along with splash over and beach erosion.

PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...

A Coastal Flood Warning means that flooding is occurring or imminent. Coastal residents in the warned area should be alert for rising water...and take appropriate action to protect life and property.

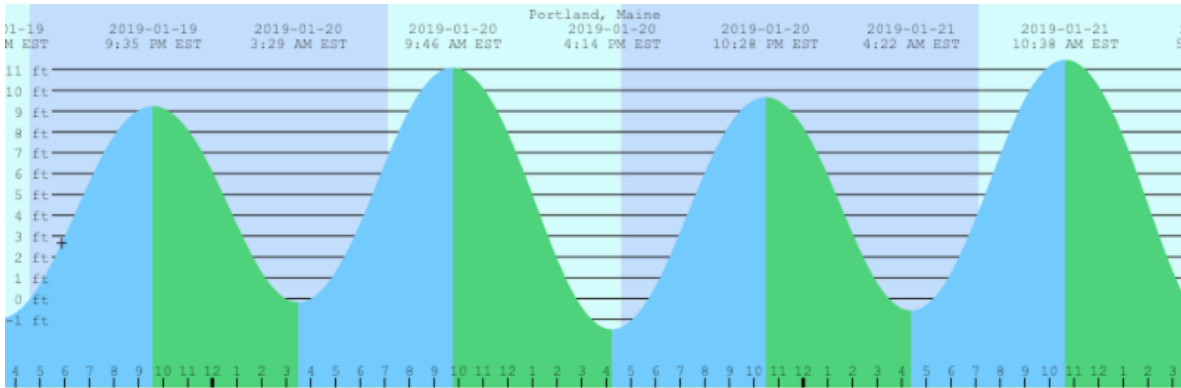
