

PETER BLACKSTONE: My name is Peter Blackstone. My wife Katlyn and I live at 76 Cumberland Ave, a two family house I purchased in November, 1979.

I'm a retired Portland elementary school teacher, who started as long-term sub at the Jack School and ended my career teaching in the Many Rivers program at Hall School. I now work as a musician, playing accordion and guitar in the Maine Squeeze, Mainely Folk, and the Casco Bay Tango Project.

Besides music, my other passion is growing plants. We have beautiful gardens at our home and my daughter Elke, who lives in our house next door, and I have a community garden plot on North Street. I grow succulents and orchids year round in my house and am currently the President of the Maine Orchid Society.

NED CHESTER: Ned is a founding member of the MHNO and his signature shows up on our original Articles of Incorporation. He's currently finishing a four-year term, has served eight years in the past and was the MHNO President from 1980-1981.

He loves sailing and historical fiction, home repair jobs (!), gardening, hanging out with Barbara and with his two sons and grandchildren. Ned has been a dedicated resident of Munjoy Hill since 1977 and splits his time between

CARLE HENRY: Carle is completing his first sixmonths on the MHNO Board after being appointed by the Board to fulfill the remainder of a former Board member's term. During that time he has advocated strongly on behalf of a variety of community issues and has never missed a meeting or committee commitment.
