The Munjoy Hill Neighborhood Organization and the Bayside, Parkside and East Bayside Neighborhood Associations will co-host a remote candidates forum on Monday, October 25th at 6:30 pm. Troy Bennett of the Bangor Daily News will be the moderator.

All of the candidates for City Council seats have indicated they plan to participate. The At-Large Candidates are: Roberto Rodriquez, Travis Curran, Brandon Mazer, and Stuart Tisdale. Both District 1 candidates, Anna Trevorrow and Sarah Michniewicz, are expected to participate. District 2 candidates Victoria Pelletier and Jon Hinck will introduce themselves as well.

Candidates for the School Board At-Large, School Board District 1 and School Board District 2 seats and the Portland Water District, all four of which are uncontested, have also been invited.



CONTESTED CITY COUNCIL RACES WILL BE DECIDED FOR:

AT-LARGE (elected City-wide)
and
DISTRICT 1 (Munjoy Hill, Islands and part of downtown)
and
DISTRICT 2 (West End and part of downtown)

Folks who live on Munjoy Hill will be voting in the District 1 and At-Large races. There are four candidates for one At-Large seat so that race will be decided using rank choice voting. To maximize your impact, you should vote for at least your first and second choice.

In-person absentee voting is available in Room 24 of City Hall, 9 am - 4:30 pm, Monday - Friday through October 28th. Regular voting will take place on Election Day, Tuesday November 2nd at the East End Community School, 195 North Street, from 7:00 am - 8:00 pm.



"Walk Among the Shadows" Performances in Eastern Cemetery: "The Secret History of Eastern Cemetery"

The non-profit group Spirits Alive is offering their popular "Walk Among the Shadows" event this October in Eastern Cemetery. This year's theme is "The Secret History of the Eastern Cemetery - Movers and Shakers in the Old Burial Ground".

Seven Spirits will rise from their graves to tell stories of their time in the Old Burial Ground: true tales of new stones, old stones, overcrowding, unexpected relocations, and more. Audience members will be led through Eastern Cemetery by specters, encountering each story at a different location within the graveyard.

The event occurs live at Eastern Cemetery. The remaining performances are on October 28-30, from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. There are also twilight performance on Sundays, Oct. 24 and 31 from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m.

Audience groups will enter from the 224 Congress Street gate every 20 minutes during the event on a first-come, first-served basis. Each Walk Among the Shadows performance lasts about 40 minutes. The audience is cautioned to dress for outdoor evening weather and slightly uneven terrain.

Tickets are available on Eventbrite or at the gate. Suggested donation for admission is \$10 (\$5 for under 12). Spirits Alive is a non-profit organization formed in 2006, and dedicated to the preservation of Eastern Cemetery. Eastern Cemetery, 224 Congress Street, is Portland's oldest graveyard,

founded in 1668. All proceeds from this event go to Spirits Alive to help accomplish their twin missions of education and preservation. More info at spiritsalive.org.
